



Cancer Prevention Report



- 25,000 people diagnosed with cancer every year.
- 2019 Alcohol caused about 6 percent of all cancer deaths (over 640 deaths)



Estimated proportion of new cases in 2020 attributable to alcohol drinking, Aotearoa, both sexes.



Cancer Prevention



- Alcohol causes 7 types of cancer
- All types of alcohol increase cancer risk
- No safe minimum level of alcohol use
- Not just an issue for heavy drinkers.
- Māori experience higher burden of alcohol related cancer.



Equity Charter: Goals

- 1. Te Tiriti o Waitangi: Commitment and application of Te Tiriti o Waitangi is evident throughout the organisation
- 2. Kotahitanga: Everyone is aware of and enabled to address inequities
- 3. Mana Taurite: Equity is embedded in all policies, structures, systems and services
- 4. Mātauranga: CSNZ funded research improves equitable cancer outcomes across the continuum for all New Zealanders
- 5. Whaitaua: CSNZ advocacy improves equity outcomes across the continuum for all New Zealanders
- 6. Haepapatanga ki te hapori: Accountability mechanisms are embedded throughout the organisation
- 7. Mahi Arataki: Our equity strategies are sustained and responsive to changing equity needs
- 8. Kaitiakitanga: Sustainable and eco-friendly processes are embedded throughout the organisation



How Alcohol causes cancer...



- Alcohol is broken down in the body to produce acetaldehyde.
- Acetaldehyde bonds to DNA and increases the risk of mutations and impaired cell replication.
- Alcohol increases serum oestrogen levels-carcinogenic effect on breast tissue.
- The high energy content of alcohol can also cause weight gain and weight-related-cancers.



Health Promotion Strategic Plan 2020-2025

Alcohol Priorities - Advocate to:

- 1. Raise public awareness of the alcohol-related cancer risks.
- 2. Raise the price of alcoholic beverages through taxation and minimum pricing.
- 3. Restrict all forms of alcohol promotion (including digital media)
- 4. Reduce the availability of alcohol inc greater community control to constrain the right of appeal by vested interests
- 5. Ensure Cancer Society policies are consistent with alcohol being a Group 1 carcinogen.



Campaign target: Women, 25-45, priority populations.

Part 2: Alcohol environment (easy access, availability, affordability) and cancer risk.

Help gain public support for our policy asks.



Part 1: Key messages

- 1. Alcohol causes cancer.
- 2. Not drinking or less alcohol reduces the risk of seven types of cancer, including mouth, throat, voice box, oesophagus (food pipe), liver, bowel and breast (in women).
- 3. Less alcohol = less cancer

Alcohol causes at least seven types of cancer. Take a look at our video below to see which cancers share alcohol as a risk factor.
